TINA HALFORD graduated from the University Amsterdamse Homeschool voor de Kunsten (The Netherlands) with a degree in Modern Theater Dance. She has worked as a dancer and performer with various choreographers and companies like: Anton Lachky, Guy Nader|Maria Campos, Vero Cendoya, Colectivo CLA, Los INnato, Angels Margarit, Quan Bui Ngnoc, Liat T Waysbort and Kompani Hanni amongst others. Since 2013 she has been participating in and producing cultural projects in Central America, generating a link of exchange between Europe and Latin America. Together with Raul Martinez she is co-founder of VAYA Art of Human Movement (based in Freiburg, Germany). With this project they have created pieces for the National Dance Company of El Salvador amongst other projects of creation, investigation and education. VAYA ART OF HUMAN MOVEMENT is a project that emerged from the idea of creating bridges between Europe and Central America, using cultural and artistic exchange of the Art of human movement. Since 2015 Tina Halford (Germany) and Raul Martinez (El Salvador) has come together to develop this project using various structures like festivals, workshops and pieces for stage generating small connections and networks between the continents.

SONIA RODRÍGUEZ was born in Las Palmas de Gran Canarias (Spain) in 1974. Her professional career began as an interpreter and dancer for the Cia Provisional Dance, then continued with Cia Charleroi Danses, Cia En-Knap and Cia Gisela Rocha. After working in different projects and companies, she joined Cia Rui Horta where besides being a dancer, she was also an assistant of choreography. She took part in creating pieces for different companies like Scottish Dance Theater and Cia Norrdans. In 2002 she was awarded best dancer of the Certamen Coreográfico de Madrid which gave her the chance to participate in the American Dance Festival in 2002. That year she worked with Cía H2dance and was assistant of choreography and interpreter of the Cía Lanonima Imperial; Cia Lior Lev; Cía Cobosmika and Cía La Baraka. During the years since she joined other companies such as Cie Yann Lheureux, Cie Dysoundbo, and Hausgemacht Company. In 2013 she was invited to perform at the Beijing Dance Festival. Attakkalari Centre for Movement Arts in residence to choreograph the piece *Absence / Presence* in 2014. In 2016 she had a residency at the Choreographische Residenz CC Heidelberg with the piece "Mabel". In 2017 she collaborated with Marion Sparber, performing in the piece "Impromptu at Alps Move Festival and 18. Kemptener Tanzherbst. Since 2002 she has her own Company, Cía. Sonia Rodríguez. Her first solo, *Caos*, was awarded third best performer prize at the 8th International Solo Dance event at Stuttgart and won the prize for best choreography at Danza Calviá Festival 2005. Since 2013 Sonia is based in Berlin.

KENAN DINKELMANN grew up in Passau, Germany. He graduated from Artez School of Dance with a BA in performing arts. He then completed the SEAD postgraduate program Bodhi Projects directed by Susan Quinn. He toured Europe with Bodhi Projects in works by Josef Frucek & Linda Kapetanea, Martin Nachbar and Robert Clark. As a freelance dancer Kenan has worked with Johannes Wieland, Marion Sparber and Anton Lachky. From 2015 to 2017 he was a member of the Stadttheater Bielefeld dance company where he danced in works by Wim Vandekeybus, Simone Sandroni and Sharon Fridman. Kenan is a guest teacher at Die Etage in Berlin, Stadttheater Bielefeld and the University of Bielefeld.

She took part in the coaching project for choreographers SiWiC in Zürich: 2007 under the direction of Susanne Linke, 2008 under Jochen Heckmann and 2009 under Philippe Saire. In 2009/10 she worked as a choreographic assistant for Company Mafalda at Stadttheater Saarbrücken and Stadttheater Freiburg. From 2012 to 2014 she worked with Cathy Sharp Dance Ensemble. During this time she was also working as a guest at Stadttheater St. Gallen, performing in pieces by Marco Santi and Anton Lachky/ Cie. Les Slowaks. From 2015 to 2017 Patricia worked as a guest dancer and performer at Konzert Theater Bern in *Das Schloss* by Kafka under the director of Estefania Miranda. In the same theater she performed with director Claudia Meyer in Elfriede Jelinek's play *Die Schutzbefohlenen* and in *Die Reise von Klaus und Edith durch den Schacht zum Mittelpunkt der Erde* by Lukas Barfuß. Since 2015 Patricia has been collaborating with the Anton Lachky Dance Company in Belgium. They have created the piece *Side Effects*, which is touring internationally.
